DEFIBRILLATOR TRAINING SESSIONS

Stella Anderson has very kindly organised two training sessions on how to use the defibrillators at the Church and Kirk Centre. A total of 25 people took part in the training. More sessions are planned for the New Year. The defibrillators are registered with the Scottish Ambulance Service, which means if someone finds themselves in the position of having to deal with someone suffering a cardiac arrest and dial 999 they will be advised where the nearest defibrillator is. They will be given the access code for the nearest one. The access code for both of ours is 'C195'. We would encourage people to be aware of our defibrillators and to let others know about them. If you would like to undertake the training, then please contact Stella, stellaanderson20@gmail.com. You do not need any training to use the defibrillators as the machines tell you what to do, but the benefit of training is that it will enhance your confidence in using them.











HELP FOR THOSE STRUGGLING

We know that many people will be finding life financially difficult at the moment. If you know of anyone who is struggling, please let them know that we can help. We have contact details for agencies and groups that may be able to help.

We have a project running in conjunction with Cults Primary school. Boxes with food and warm hats and gloves are in the Kirk Centre, people can help themselves to any item with no questions asked.

Our Hub Café is also open for anyone wanting a warm place to sit. A number of coffees and teas have been paid for under a pay it forward scheme. Anyone wanting a free tea or coffee simply needs to ask for 'Tina' when placing their order. If anyone would like to pay for an extra cup of coffee or tea to support this scheme, they can do so by telling the server they wish to pay for 'Tina's' drink.

Aberdeen City Council have a list of warm spaces that people are invited to use to save on heating at home. Cults Library is one such space. Their opening hours are Monday and Tuesday 10am-1pm and 2pm-5pm We hope to add our café to this growing list of spaces found on the council website: -

LIGHTING PROJECT

Over the next month or so work will be being carried out to replace the lighting in the sanctuary. This is in response to a recommendation from Presbytery and will be funded from money raised for that purpose as part of our 2021 "Thanks 'Giving' Day" supplemented by a contribution from a legacy from the estate of the late Stan & Flo Hicks.

The current lighting, which was installed in 1960 has served us well, but technology has changed, and it is anticipated that the new scheme will pick out some of the architectural features of the building as well as improving the "task" lighting.

By necessity, the work will be incremental, with the final commissioning and configuration at the end of the project, at which point the full impact will be visible.

WHEELCHAIR PUSHING AT WOODEND

We are looking for new volunteers to help with bringing patients in the Stroke Rehabilitation Unit at Woodend Hospital to the 10 am Sunday morning services organised by the Hospital Chaplaincy Unit.

Prior to the pandemic, Cults Parish Church used to organise a rota of volunteers to help with this activity once a month. At that time, we had a large enough group of volunteers for individuals to only be required to help once every three or four months. The services are hopefully due to start again in the New Year but, for various reasons, our group of available volunteers has diminished to the extent that we may no longer be able to offer this service as a Church.


