Message from our minister, Rev Shuna Dicks......

Dear Friends,

Now that things have settled down and we have the summer holiday season more or less out of the way, we felt it was time to put a magazine together.

The last few years have brought many challenges and a degree of uncertainty to our church life. But most of that is now behind us and it is time to look forward. One update I want to share is what is happening within the Aberdeen West Parish Grouping. The main updates are:



- 1. Our parish is to increase in size to include the Countesswells development. Whilst this is a change to our parish boundary, I am pleased that the Parish Grouping is committed to helping with the outreach to this new housing development. We have already started discussions about how this might be achieved, and I will keep you up to date on this as time goes by. I am excited about the possibilities of reaching out to a new community and seeing how the church can get involved.
- 2. A union is to take place between Ruthrieston West and Craigiebuckler. With the Ruthrieston West Church building due to close towards the end of the year and with the Rev Kenneth Petrie due to retire next year, both churches are keen to see the union happen as quickly and smoothly as possible and are well on their way.
- 3. Peterculter are working towards a union with Durris & Drumoak. The union will enable Peterculter to proceed with calling a full-time minster as a half post has been assigned to Durris & Drumoak under the Presbytery Mission Plan. They too have begun the work of arranging the union. As of the 1st of September, Rev Corne Randall will be taking up a temporary appointment within the Parish Grouping. His main duties will be to serve the parish of Peterculter until such times as a new minister is appointed. Corne has been with the Rev Keith Blackwood on familiarisation for the last year under the same scheme as Sharmann.
- 4. Mannofield, like ourselves will remain a single parish. It is anticipated that the area of Garthdee will be added to the Parish Grouping area in the near future. This will have an impact on all of us, but the logistics have still to be worked out

With all these changes, please be assured that we have been working with the best of intentions towards Cults Parish Church. The Church of Scotland as whole is going through a period of massive change and no congregation or parish is exempt from this. We are all having to play our part.

Looking to the future I am really keen that we strengthen ourselves as a church. And with that in mind I am asking everyone to consider how they might play their part. As a first step you will find enclosed with this magazine a leaflet highlighting a number of our groups that require more help. What we would like you to do is consider if you can help in anyway and commit to signing up to help. You can use the form to sign up or to ask for more information. At our service on the 3rd of September, we will be focussing on service. This would be the ideal Sunday to return your form. You can place it in the offering plate on your way in or, if you would rather, you can return it to the Church Office.

Now, I know that some of you will be wondering what on earth you can do to help, as you feel unable to commit to physically helping. For those of you that fall into that category, there are three things you can do. One is to continue to support the church financially. The second is to continue worshipping with us, whether that is on site or from home. The third is to pray for the work of our church, asking for God's guidance and strength for those who serve our church so diligently and give so much of their time to everything we do. Prayer is an important part of our church life – it really does help knowing that what we do is held in prayer.

On the 3rd of September we will be dedicating our Guild. The Guild Motto is 'Whose we are, and whom we serve', a reminder to us all that church is more than a community of people that gather to worship on a Sunday morning. Church is about service too. Serving others and serving God.

We are a wonderful church community and I continue to be inspired and lifted by the wonderful people who serve us in Cults. Thank you for the part you play in this.
