


- 3 'Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

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
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We are thrilled to introduce this new initiative from our Worship & Faith Journey Core Group. Cults Connections is a replacement for our Evening Services, which have run during the winter months for a number of years. How long each session takes will depend on you. There is no right or wrong way to use this material. We simply offer it as a supplement to the prerecorded worship videos,



Living well

Matthew 5:3-10

1

This session is an introduction to Matthew 5:3-10 - The Beatitudes.

The Oxford English Dictionary gives the meaning of the word 'Beatitude' as '1. Supreme blessedness or happiness, 2. An ascription of special blessedness, especially on those pronounced by Jesus in the Sermon on the Mount.' Most versions of the Bible used the word 'Blessed', although some versions, such as the Good News, translate the word as 'Happy'. There is a wonderful beauty, order and rhythm in the eight Beatitudes, an assurance of God's blessing, a kingdom characteristic, and a promise of what lies ahead.



Living openly

Matthew 5:3-4

2

This session looks at the first two Beatitudes. We will consider what it means to live in an open way - open to God, to others, and the joy and pain around us.

Being poor in spirit means being open to God, rather than us playing God in our own lives, acknowledging our needs and being interdependent rather than independent.

Mourning in this context is not about bereavement rather it is about the pain and injustice in the world and feeling God's pain about how far things are from from God's purposes. It is also about owning the fact that we are part of the problem and refusing to run from pain.



- 2. Did Jesus mean it is good to be poor?
- 3. What things do we mourn?
- 4. What is the effect on people and communities of refusing to mourn?

Watch the news on a daily basis and allow yourself to 'mourn'. Use this as a springboard to action and prayer.

Read Isaiah 61:1-3. Close with one of the prayers from the book on page 35 of 'I ife Attitudes'.





Living purposefully

3

Matthew 5:5-6

This session looks at the 3rd and 4th Beatitude. We will consider what it means to live purposefully, living life as a gift from God, and aligning ourselves with God's priorities and values.

According to Michael Crosby 'meekness means committing our lives to fulfil God's purposes.' (Spirituality of the Beatitudes, p113) Robert Warren said 'The biblical understanding of righteousness fully integrates the personal and the social, the inner and outer worlds. They become part of one single tapestry, woven together again and again.



Living lovingly

4

Matthew 5:7-8

This session looks at the 5th and 6th Beatitudes. We will consider what it is to live lovingly, giving to others the same reckless generosity that we receive from God and being sincere. Robert Warren said 'Mercy is...about doing good to others and giving them what is needed for their fuller experience of life. Mercy is part of a 'virtuous spiral' or current of grace.' Of purity of heart he said it 'does not seem to be about any sort of practice. It is essentially a private, even hidden work...It is about the inner stillness, waiting and discerning that are at the heart of true justice...' (Living Well)


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Talk about it

- 2. How and where have you experienced mercy?
- 3. Is 'pure' the same as 'nice'?
- 4. Is it naive to see the best in people?

Get Real!



Think of a practical way that you can 'live' mercy and/or purity of heart in the coming month.

Go deep...



Create a still atmosphere. You could light a candle and play some music.

Read 1 John 2:29-3:3. Close with one of the prayers on page 53/54 of 'Life Attitudes'.





Living differently

5

Matthew 5:9-10

This final session looks at the 7th and 8th Beatitudes. We will consider what it means to live differently, being peacemakers and what being persecuted for righteousness sake means. Of being peacemakers, Robert Warren wrote 'It underlines just how central to the nature of God peacemaking is'. And of persecution 'The goal is not persecution, but holding on to the will of God. The Beatitudes alert us to the fact that there may be a real cost in following our vocation, but that problems and trials should neither come as a surprise nor knock us off our guard'. (Living Well)



- 3. How do we discern when hostility is 'persecution' and when it is deserved criticism?
