Dear Friends,

As we approach Easter I wanted to reflect on the importance of this season. Faith is a very personal matter, and we all have our own struggles grappling with what it is that draws us to the life of Jesus.

What pulls us into his story? And how do we explain the Easter story?



At a recent meeting of the Preaching Cohort I have been invited to be part of, the story of Easter Morning was discussed at length. We noted how difficult it is to explain just what happened and it was pointed out that not one of the Gospel accounts gives any explanation. Instead, we are invited to marvel at the story. If the grave could not contain Jesus, what makes us think our brains can. The idea of Christ risen is something to wonder at, not to try and explain away. Thinking this way gives us an opportunity to enjoy the celebration of Easter and proclaim the risen Christ in a different way. We know he lives because He lives in us.

Christ lives in us – each of us, not contained to a Bible story, but in the living followers of Jesus Christ, our Saviour.

As a church we are invited to be part of Jesus wider story. Our task is to invite others in and be part of the story.

I wish you a very blessed Easter, and I hope you will feel very much part of our celebrations.


